## **Technology at School and Home**

At Edmonds and other schools, we have been noticing an **increase in concerns** around the use of technology. Often problems originate from outside of school but end up impacting student learning and well-being. As parents/caregivers, supervising children in a digital world it is very challenging as more and more interactions are happening online. Traditional views of supervision change when children are online or on social media.

Here are some basic tips on understanding and supervising what is happening in the online world.

- Create rules for media and technology that are in line with your family's values. Discuss these rules with your child(ren) in a way that is open and receptive to their needs and interests. For example, set time aside each day when there are "no screens". Rules may change as children get older.
- Have devices where they can be supervised. This can look like moving the laptop to the main room or putting cell phones in the drawer after a certain time.
- You can't always control exactly what your kids will see or experience, but you can help them learn how to process situations and manage emotions around what comes up. Use the mistakes as a chance for children to learn about the world around them in age-appropriate ways – build trust!
- Learn about what your child knows and ask them to be a "teacher". Your children may know more than you about social media. Ask them the networks they use, why they like it, who they connect with, etc.
- Know your child's passwords and sites they are on.
- Children often do not have the same understanding of safety, privacy, and security that adults have – this is the same as on social media. Consider others' privacy and rules around taking pictures of others and uploading them.
- Understand how your child(ren) behaves online and encourage digital citizenship. Calling people names, pretending to someone else, sending hurtful messages are all potentially forms of bullying. You want to know who your child is online.
